**Adventure, outdoor sports, and powerful emotions—the EOFT is coming soon!** Along for the ride is **Sophie Planque**.

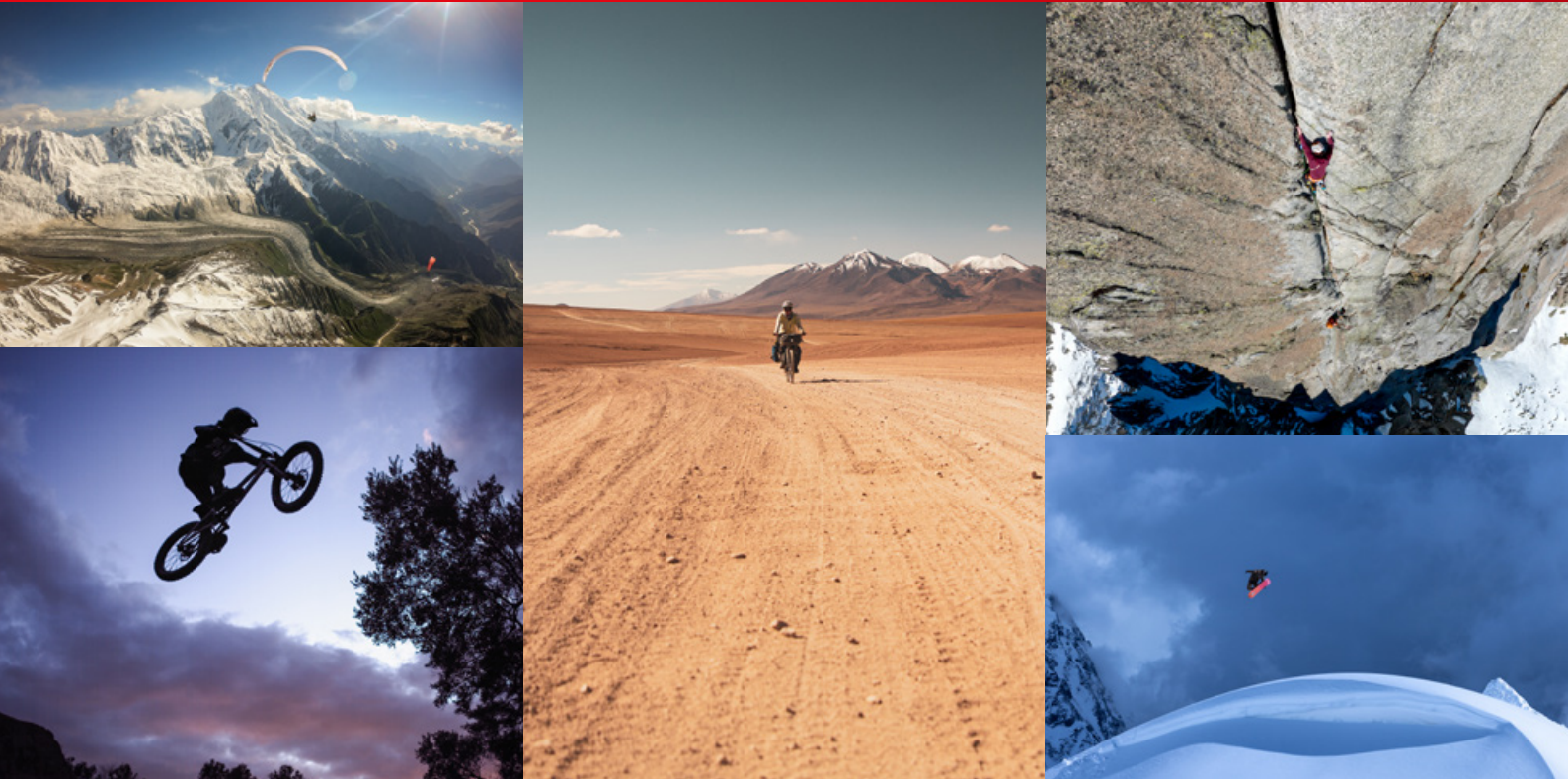
The photojournalist sets out on a journey from Alaska to Tierra del Fuego on her bike; the outcome is a visually powerful epic that focuses on each moment with sensitivity and intensity. **972 Breakdowns** is about the adventure of a lifetime. Five art students ride their **Ural motorcycles through Russia, Kazakhstan, and Mongolia**, to name just a few places, all the way to New York, perhaps creating a new art form in the process: The Breakdown Theater. Like any art form, this one fulfills an end in itself and illustrates that sometimes the journey truly is the destination.

Experience world-class alpine climbing in **Triple Edge**. **Michi Wohlleben** and **Lukas Hinterberger** celebrate an alpinistic world first on the Salbitschijen (2985m), and in the mountain bike film **The Nine Wheels**, a Swiss family refuses to surrender to their fate and instead shows how uniting together inspires hope and surmounts limitations.

Following the **German premiere on 11 October 2023 at the Alte Kongresshalle in Munich**, the program can be seen at **more than 350 events in nine countries**. The total running time is around 120 minutes. With moderation and additional activities, each event lasts approximately two and a half to three hours.

## The Program



### THE GREAT TRAVERSE

Bike adventure: Sophie Planque and Jérémy Vaugeois cycle from Alaska to the southern tip of Patagonia. During their two-and-a-half-year journey, Sophie not only photo-documents the fascinating landscapes of North, Central, and South America but also the encounters with the diverse people whom she and Jérémy meet along the way. By the end of their journey, the two have not only become better acquainted with two continents and their inhabitants but also with themselves.

### 972 BREAKDOWNS

Johannes, Elisabeth, Efy, Anne, and Kaupo have just finished their art studies. They now want to see the world, explore foreign cultures, and gather new experiences.

They set off for New York on four Russian Ural sidecar motorcycles. From Halle (Saale, Germany), they will travel through Eastern Europe, Kazakhstan, and Mongolia to the far north of Russia. From there, they want to cross the Bering Strait to North America. But before they get that far, the five have to contend with the unrelenting breakdowns of their old and notoriously unreliable motorcycles.





### THE NINE WHEELS

Emeric (10) and Raoul (13) Schneeberger know almost every bike park in Europe. They live in a motorhome with their parents Toni and Laetitia and ride in a new location every few days. But their mountain biking lifestyle has its obstacles: Laetitia suffers from a neurodegenerative disease, which is the reason the family chooses to live completely in the here and now.

### SUMMITS IN THE SKY

The team led by French paraglider Antoine Girard sets course for the Karakorum and explores the airspace between the region's mighty seven- and eight-thousand-meter peaks. Even though oxygen quickly becomes scarce at high altitudes, the team is within reach of a new paragliding altitude record.



### TRIPLE EDGE

The two alpinists and mountain guides Michi Wohlleben and Lukas Hinterberger are taking on an extraordinary alpine challenge. They want to climb the three ridges of the Salbitschijen (2985m) in winter. This means they are in for an adventure at an altitude of almost 3000 meters.

### SHIFTING

Snowboarder Camille Armand is known for his hard-charging yet refined riding style, especially in the mountains around Chamonix where he has lived since he was a teen. But it is in Norway's Lyngen Alps where Monsieur Armand's flair for riding deep snow and exposed lines is on full display—and is big-screen worthy.
